First, for the precision of his vocabulary in both oral and written expressions; second, for his unobtrusive good manners; third, for his worried little frown conflicting with his engaging smile and trusting manner towards me; fourth, for a slight tic in the form of a blink; fifth, for the fact that when someone had to be moved out of his group, the others all elected that he should be the one to go, and he said to me with a quiet little smile, 'I'm the one who's to shift, Mrs. Arnold. They don't want me.'
- Sixth, for the fact that though he could scarcely swim three strokes, he was the most gallant and persistent starter. Seventh, he obviously has brains.
- 4 Some clever boys at this age are rather arrogant, ready to hatch out as budding intellectuals as soon as they enter secondary schools, and to emerge from university some years later with horn-rimmed spectacles and a bundle of capital letters after their names.
- Adam isn't like that. He certainly has an intellect, but I doubt if he'll ever become what is usually termed an intellectual, and although he wrote in his Personal Record book that he hopes to be an author when he grows up, I don't think he'll ever be an arty or bohemian type either.
- It is strange how character and personality can be set in a mould even at this stage. With fair accuracy, you can picture how they will be in twenty years' time. What I see in Adam tells me that he has the strength of character to emerge into maturity as a true individual. From that level mind of his, he will be able to look out calmly upon a blemished world and have compassion for it. Already he can quietly face his own weakness of others, he will have the same insight and tolerance.
- He plays chess, he loves good books, he went with his parents to a chamber music concert and loved it, he'd love to have a library of his own. Already he knows the joys of solitude. He is able to be alone and at peace, yet he mixes easily with others, though with an entire absence of gang spirit. Adam will never go along with the crowd, a victim of mass training and hysteria, his ideas stereotyped and his reactions prefabricated. He is the rare and valuable type who, though they relish and are happy in solitude, yet have a capacity for sensitive and profound communion with others.
- The relationship Adam makes in life will not be superficial ones, and therefore, as well as joy and fulfilment, they will also bring him pain and disappointment. Even, he could turn out to be a poet or a composer but never the flamboyant type that brandishes its Freudian complexes before the world.
