Chocolate Town

If you love chocolate, maybe you have eaten a bar of Cadbury's Bournville chocolate. But Bournville isn't just the (0) name of an English chocolate bar. It's the name of a (9) which was built especially for workers at the Cadbury's chocolate factory. George and Richard Cadbury took (10) the cocoa and chocolate business from their father in 1861. A few years later, they decided to (11) the factory out of the centre of Birmingham, a city in the middle of England, to a new location where they could (12) their business. They chose an area close to the railways and canals so that they could receive milk deliveries easily and send the finished products to stores across the country.

Here, the air was much cleaner than in the city centre, and the Cadbury brothers thought it would be a much healthier place for their (13) to work. They named the site Bournville after a local river called 'The Bourn'. 'Ville', the French word for town, was used because at the time, people thought French chocolate was of the highest (14) ever. The new factory was opened in 1879. Close to it, they built a village where the factory workers could (15) in. By 1900, there were 313 houses on the site, and many more were built later.

The Cadbury family believed that it was right to help other people. They thought their workers deserved to live and work in good conditions. Nevaeh was worried Tin Tin would be alone and wrote her a letter to check if she was okay, addressing it to heaven to make sure she would see it. Although her mum Tamara, 26, warned that heaven might be too far away to send a letter, Nevaeh insisted and the pair dropped it in a postbox. Incredibly, they received a parcel in the post a week later after a postman at Royal Mail spotted the letter and decided to write back.

He wrote Nevaeh a message from Tin Tin, explaining that she had to go to heaven and Nevaeh didn't need to worry about her - and even included a toy cat that looked just like her and a book to read with her mum whenever she missed her. Tamara told her little girl that her cat had transformed into a star and the letter she received back said that whenever she looked up at the sky, the brightest star there would be Tin Tin.

She received a letter, toy and book in the post a week later. It said: "I want you to know that I'm okay and have made some nice friends here, one of them called Tibbles snores so loud when we have cat naps. I'm being fed and looked after well by the angels. I know you are sad that I'm not there with you but please don't be. In here is a

little cuddle cat that I thought looks a little like me. So, if you do feel sad you can cuddle him like how we used to." It ended; "Forever your best friend, Tin Tin." and a paw mark.

Teaching assistant Tamara said: "I was **gobsmacked** when the parcel arrived, it was so moving to open it with Nevaeh. Nevaeh addressed the letter to 'The brightest star in the clouds, Heaven. I think she really needed some closure so she could start to move on after Tin Tin died, and what this postman has done really did that for us. Nevaeh and Tin Tin were best friends, they had a really close bond, whenever they saw each other they were so happy. When we sent the letter I didn't expect anything to come back and I don't think Nevaeh did either but it was important to her to say farewell."

"Getting a response was the last thing we expected, and I'm just so thankful to the Royal Mail and the postman for writing that letter and sending it to us - and of course for the toys too." Mum Tamara said she was taken aback by the parcel they got in return. "I tracked down the postman that did it and although I didn't get a chance to speak to him, I did speak to his wife, and they have cats too so they totally understood why Nevaeh was so upset. It has really helped, her sleeping is getting back to normal and now that she knows Tin Tin is okay, she is starting to get over the loss and is a bit happier." Tin Tin had to be put down due to heart failure earlier this year and Nevaeh, who was struggling to sleep, eventually decided she needed to say a proper goodbye.

Vaping

Manipulating teens to get them to buy harmful products is nothing new. Old – school cigarette companies did it for years. In the 1930s, '40s, and '50s, cigarette ads featured images of smoking students wearing graduation caps or cheerleading uniforms.

Today, vaping is taking over smoking as a growing concern among teenagers. (27) _____. Though vaping companies claim that their target are adults looking for an alternative to cigarettes, their ads feature colourful graphics and something else to make its product nearly irresistible to young users – it masks the taste of nicotine with sweet flavours like mango.

Last year, vaping companies announced it would stop selling most flavoured pods in stores and added strict age – verification methods online. (28) _____. This is yet another sign that many of them are hopelessly hooked.

Teens may have been attracted to fruity flavours at first, but that's not what's gotten them hooked. (29) _____. Sometimes some of these flavours contain even more nicotine than cigarettes. What's the big deal? Nicotine can damage your brain, specifically the parts that control your mood, learning, and attention span.

The health risks of nicotine are scary enough, but here's the scariest part: There's now evidence that vaping may be destroying your lungs. In August, more than 450 cases of severe lung illnesses in young adults – all related to vaping, were reported. (30) _____. Plus, a recent study found that vaping also changes blood vessels, even if you do it only once.

Now, some people are fighting back. After winding up in the hospital with a collapsed lung, a patient was shown pictures of his lungs. (31) _____. This made the patient post the pictures of his damaged lungs on social media to create awareness of the dangers of vaping and this inspired other young people to quit. (32) _____. He at least managed to spread a simple message to urge teens to support each other in kicking their vaping habits.

So That's What They Are For!

A – The tiny pockets in your blue jeans...

...is for your pocket watch. Well, maybe not yours, but the American cowboys who made blue jeans famous in the 1800 were grateful for it. Typically, watches were carried on chains and worn in waistcoats, but hard manual labour made that less practical. Outdoors, the watch pocket on any pair of jeans did just the trick- even after watches moved to wrists.

B – The funky orange thing...

...first appeared in Lego sets back in 2011. What is it for? Well, it's called a separator and it does precisely what its name suggests. One end can detach Lego bricks from the top and bottom of each other while the other end is useful for the tiny pieces that are impossible to separate otherwise. Code name 4654448, it's become an essential tool that saves your teeth, nails and sanity.

C – That little strawberry attached to your tomato pincushion...

...is an emery board for your needles, filled with tough emery sand – a combination of aluminium and iron oxides – the strawberry is historically a tool for polishing, sharpening and removing rust from your pins and needles.

D – The arrow next to the petrol symbol on your dashboard...

...is a perpetual reminder of which side your petrol cap is on. If the arrow points right, your petrol tank is on the right side, and vice versa. This handy guide is now used by most car manufacturers so you will never be stumped at the service station again!

E – The perforations on the sides of your aluminium – wrap container...

...are called end locks and, when pushed in, are meant to keep your roll secure inside the box. Many similar kitchen products, such as plastic wraps, come equipped with the same feature so you'll never rip the whole roll out of the box when you want just a single piece.

F – Washing machine dryer symbols...

...are an important part of the clothing care process, but we've all heard those scary stories of cashmere sweaters that come out of the wash three sizes too small. Knowing the dryer symbols on your clothes, like the square with a circle in the middle that indicates tumble drying allowed, can help you avoid putting the wrong garment in the tumble dryer.
